

# How to dispose of your waste

All your waste must be sorted and placed in the appropriate bins available at the recycling centre or on the street at the entrance to the residence.

## ORGANIC WASTE



*HOW - Organic waste must be placed in the appropriate containers in compostable bags, not plastic bags.*

**YES** - Food scraps and leftovers, tea and coffee filters (excluding non-compostable coffee machine pods), napkins, paper towels and tissues, dried and cut flowers or small plants.

**NO** - Non-compostable coffee pods, hot or liquid food, shellfish shells, oil, hazardous substances, rags (even if wet), glass, plastic or other impurities.

## PAPER AND CARDBOARD



*HOW - Remove cellophane wrapping before disposing of newspapers and magazines. Paper must be placed loose in the appropriate container or in paper bags. Flatten or reduce the volume of cardboard packaging.*

**YES** - Notebooks, books, newspapers and magazines, sheets of paper, flyers, photocopies, food and drink cartons (tetrapaks), wrapping paper, paper bags and envelopes, small cardboard packaging (snack boxes, biscuit boxes, cracker boxes, egg cartons, etc.).

**NO** - Wipes and tissues, carbon paper, chemical paper (receipts), baking paper, greasy and dirty paper and cardboard (e.g. pizza boxes), wallpaper, photographic paper.



## PLASTIC AND TINS



**HOW** - Packaging must be empty, free of liquid or solid residues. Rinse and crush plastic bottles and containers.

**YES** - Bottles, flasks and packaging in general, aluminium cans, tin cans, aluminium trays, aerosol cans and containers for personal hygiene products (e.g. deodorants), metal caps, aluminium foil, plastic ties, cellophane, polystyrene, plastic plates and cups.

**NO** - Plastic or metal containers with symbols indicating hazardous substances, Tetra Pak containers, CDs, videotapes, cassette tapes and their cases, plastic cutlery, toys, garden furniture, clotheslines, pots, cans and other plastic or metal objects that are not packaging, construction items.

## GLASS



**HOW** - Place loose packaging in the container without using bags.

**YES** - Bottles, glasses, jugs, vases and jars, tins, ampoules, IV bags, vials, containers in general without caps or lids.

**NO** - Containers with symbols indicating hazardous substances, Pyrex glass containers and ovenproof dishes, crystal objects, plates, cups and other ceramic, porcelain or terracotta objects, mirrors, broken glass, light bulbs, fluorescent lamps, neon tubes.

## NON-RECYCLABLE WASTE



**HOW** - If you have any doubts about how to dispose of waste, always consult the 'Rifiutologo' ([www.ilrifiutologo.it](http://www.ilrifiutologo.it)). If you are still unsure, it is best to dispose of the materials in the non-recyclable dry waste bin, so as not to compromise the quality of the separate collection and undermine the daily efforts of those who correctly separate different types of waste.

**YES** - All non-recyclable waste, including sanitary towels, nappies, pet litter, cotton wool, incandescent light bulbs, CDs, videotapes and their cases, plastic cutlery, toys, ceramic, terracotta or porcelain objects, mirrors, Pyrex glass containers and oven dishes, crystal objects, broken glass, corks, greasy and dirty paper and cardboard, and shellfish shells.

**NO** - Recyclable waste and packaging made from recoverable materials, hazardous substances, liquid food, oil, grass, flowers or leaves, plants, roots, and twigs.
